Responsibilities

What we said	What we did
Build a basic guessing game	Check!
Keep track of players by name	Check!
Have separate games going on for each player	Check!
Give entertaining clues when the player guesses wrong	Implemented “hotter” and “colder” hints
Have a high score page listing average guesses per player	Only shows best number of guesses per player
Have a cool animated explosion when the player guesses right	Failed miserably

Flask	Back-end web application development
HTML & CSS	Client-side interface
Cloud9	All development and hosting
